

Mrs. Roosevelt Attends Tea At Exchange

Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt was among the early arrivals yesterday at the housewarming tea held by the Self Help Exchange at its third and latest establishment at 1428 U street N.W.

Mrs. Henry Morgenthau, jr., who is a director of the exchange and whose husband, the Secretary of the Treasury, is honorary president, conducted Mrs. Roosevelt through the building. A chorus of "participants" of the exchange also sang during Mrs. Roosevelt's visit and later she chatted with some of the members.

The exchange has features similar to establishments already operating at 2529 Pennsylvania avenue N.W. and at 920 Snows Court N.W. A store, a laundry, a print shop, a lunch room, a wood pile and a weaving shop are among the projects which Mrs. Roosevelt examined. Visitors to the exchange also were shown a moving picture of its activities.

Produce from the Self Help Farm at Kensington, Md., and bread from the exchange at Pennsylvania avenue, where 1,000 loaves are baked daily, also were exhibited. Participants of the exchange are paid in script for their services which they exchange for various articles.

Mrs. Charles Carroll Glover was chairman of the tea tables and among those pouring were Mrs. Stanley Reed, Mrs. Bennett Champ Clark, Mrs. Robert Woods Bliss, Mrs. Chauncey Depew and Mrs. Peyton Hawes Dunn.
